

Gascosage Electric Cooperative Energy Audit & Weatherization Program

What does an energy audit do?

Gascosage Electric Cooperative's new energy audit program is designed to improve the energy efficiency of our members' homes, reduce energy use and help the member save on monthly electric bills.

Who is eligible?

All members are eligible for a home energy audit regardless of the type of heat and cooling systems in their homes.

What does it cost?

The cost of the energy audit will be a \$50, non-refundable fee charged to the member.

How does it work?

The program will be handled through the Missouri Ozarks Community Action (MOCA). Moca will send their own auditor to the member's home to perform the audit. All audits will be scheduled through the Gascosage office. At the time of the audit, the member will also receive an energy efficiency kit from Gascosage.

What happens after the audit?

- Upon completion of the energy audit, Gascosage and the member will receive a copy of the recommendations to improve the home's efficiency.
- The member, upon completion of the work, will be required to attest that all the recommended work has been completed and provide proof. Gascosage reserves the right to verify any, or all of the work.
- Gascosage will then file paperwork on the member's behalf to Associated Electric Cooperative. The member could qualify for 50% of their home energy improvements up to \$1000.

Is there assistance for low-income families?

For low-income families that qualify for Missouri Ozark Community Action assistance, and meet certain income and eligibility requirements, MOCA will file any and all paperwork with Associated Electric Cooperative.
